SOCIAL MEDIA AGE RESTRICTIONS

From 10th December 2025, certain social media platforms won't be allowed to let Australian children under 16 create or keep an account.

The eSafety Commissioner is running FREE 30-minute webinars to help parents and carers understand the upcoming changes to social media access for children under 16.

Information sessions will help with:

- understanding the purpose of the new age restrictions and how they aim to protect young Australians
- understanding which platforms will require users to be 16+ and what platforms they can still access
- tips and resources to support your child's online safety and wellbeing through the transition.






