Dear Families,

As the semester draws to a close, our teachers have reflected on a productive term of learning. They have completed progression reports for their classes and look forward to meeting with you next Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday for Parent/Teacher interviews.

Our final assembly for the term was run by 1CH on Monday afternoon and taught our school all about the Arctic tundra. Every student spoke with confidence.

Last Thursday, I attended the AGE Schools Summit where the Minister for Education announced a change to teaching practices across Victorian Department schools. As a school, we adjusted our practices to include phonics and phonemic awareness in 2021. Here is a summary from the Ministerial report:

Minister for Education Ben Carroll today announced the updated Victorian Teaching and Learning Model, which will be implemented in all Government schools across the state from 2025 with explicit teaching at its core.

All students from Prep to Grade 2 will be taught using a systematic synthetic phonics approach as part of their reading programs, with a minimum of 25 minutes daily explicit teaching of phonics and phonemic awareness.

This will be a core component of a comprehensive reading program that also includes explicit teaching of oral language, vocabulary, reading fluency and comprehension.

Systematic synthetic phonics is a structured approach that explicitly teaches the relationship between sounds and letters to read words.

Our Senior Boys did an outstanding job of representing us on Tuesday at Barwon Reserve and although we did not win the Final on the day, the boys should be very proud of their efforts.

We hope the holidays are a time to reset and relax as winter sets in.






St Robert's Footy Card Trading

EVERY COUNTS

Primary school attendance

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day - missing school puts them behind.

Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misse puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.

Getting in early

Attendance patterns are established early – a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and receive lower test scores than their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day – even in the early years of primary school.

What we can do

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness - There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term if it can be avoided.

"Day off" - Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

Truancy - This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents to work together.

If for any reason your child must miss school, there are things you can do with your school to ensure they don't fall behind:

. Speak with your classroom teacher and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.

Openly communicating with your child's school about all absences is a good way to

prevent attendance issues being escalated to a School Attendance Officer. A School Attendance Officer is a Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Regional Director who has authority to follow up attendance issues. Attendance issues that are escalated can lead to an
