Valentino Maccora represented St Robert's at the Tennis Tournament last week. He displayed amazing sportsmanship and resilience.




Last week Sid Smith from Year 5 completed in the Sport Climbing Australia Bouldering Championships in Queensland.

LEARNING AND TEACHING

This Friday, our entire teaching group and leadership team will join over 650 staff from the Western Region at a MACS Flourishing Learners professional development opportunity.

The day will consist of a deep dive into the Classroom Mastery program, which has been developed for Knowledge Society by leading classroom management expert, Dr Tim McDonald. Classroom Mastery is grounded in the Science of Learning and is based on insights from cognitive load theory. Safe, ordered and positive learning environments are a foundation for learning.

Our staff will further explore the explicit teaching of routines for learning and our behaviour curriculum, which has been developed over the past few years. This work is a precursor to in-school coaching opportunities for staff, aligned with the recently launched MACS 'Vision for Instruction.' This day is the first of three professional learning days for the year.

Our next school closure days to facilitate the professional development of our team are Friday August 16th Monday October 21st.



4,133 students took part and scored an average writing age of 7yrs5mo and the average writing age of our Year 2s was 9yrs!

The small dots to the left represent each school that took part and the vertical line represents St Robert's, scoring in the top 10% of participating schools.
